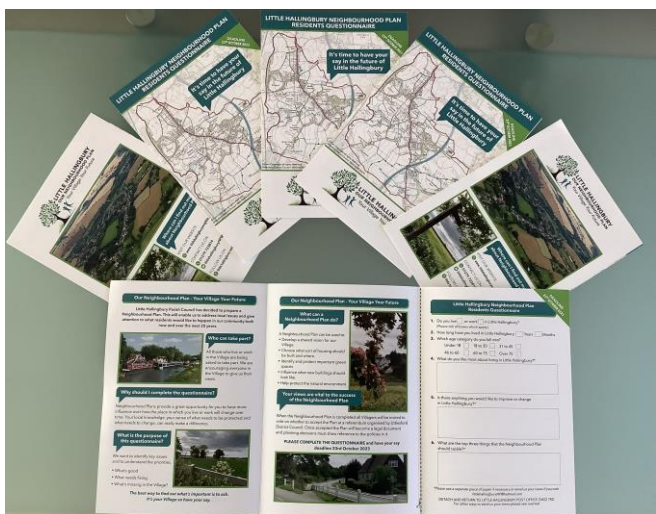




DEADLINE 23rd OCTOBER Have you completed and returned your Residents Questionnaire?

IT'S TIME TO HAVE YOUR SAY.

The ultimate 'goal' at the end of the Little Hallingbury Neighbourhood Plan process, is to decide what if any development should go where in our Village and which green spaces and heritage assets to conserve for future generations. It is an opportunity for residents to set out a positive vision for how they want their Village to develop over the next 15 years or more.

Whilst it is a lengthy process, the ability for residents to take some control is a powerful incentive to get this job done. The Residents Questionnaire is the first step in understanding what is important to the local community.

Will we be listened to?

Yes! Neighbourhood Planning is unlike previous government funded community led initiatives because it has the legal teeth to empower communities to plan for the future of their area.



This is because a Neighbourhood Plan forms part of the development plan, sitting alongside the Local Plan and adds a whole new dimension that would be too specific and detailed for the Local Plan.

Once approved decisions on planning applications will be made using both the Uttlesford Local Plan and the Little Hallingbury Neighbourhood Plan and other material considerations.
