



## **Coffee Morning and Consultation Event October 2024 - Feedback results**

The public consultation held in the Village Hall on Saturday and Sunday 12<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup> October was attended by 60 people over the two days. Those who attended were asked to complete a survey and comment form which consisted of 5 questions, attendees were also asked to place a sticker on the information boards to indicate their agreement or otherwise to the 5 questions which appeared in the survey.

Residents who were unable to attend in person were able to complete the survey monkey version of the feedback form online. This was advertised in the door drop leaflets, Village Views magazine and via Facebook and our LHNP dedicated website. We received a further 13 responses via survey monkey.

The consultation was an opportunity for Residents to comment on the draft Neighbourhood Plan vision and objectives and policy intentions at an early stage before the Plan is prepared. We received 53 responses and a summary of these is given below:

Do the LHNP Vision and Objectives meet the needs of the Village?	96%	Yes
Do you support the LHNP Policy intentions?	92%	Yes
Do you support the proposed Landscape Character and Important views policy?	96%	Yes
Do you support the Design Codes or LHNP?	98%	Yes
Do you support the Protection of Local Green Spaces?	100%	Yes

Two people said NO in response to two questions. There were four unanswered questions and one resident who answered 'Don't know' to 3 questions.

It was great to chat with those who attended and share the information that was on display. The Steering Group really appreciated the kind comments received on the day and those in the feedback. There were also a number of other comments and queries raised, and we have answered all these on the Little Hallingbury Neighbourhood Plan website.

We are continuing with the evidence gathering and developing the NP policies and proposals. There will be another opportunity to have your say when we undertake the Statutory Residents Consultation.
