As part of the ongoing efforts to preserve the unique character of Little Hallingbury, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group is working to ensure that the village's heritage buildings and assets are retained for future generations. Our Vision statement emphasises the importance of maintaining these historical treasures, and we are now able to apply for Heritage Asset status on the Local Uttlesford Heritage list for assets in the village that aren't already listed.

What is a Heritage Asset and Why Do We Need It?

A heritage asset is defined as a building, monument, site, place, area, or landscape identified as having a degree of significance meriting consideration in planning decisions due to its heritage interest. This includes both designated heritage assets, of which Little Hallingbury already has 61, and assets identified by the local planning authority.

Current Heritage Assets.

Little Hallingbury boasts 61 listed buildings on the National Heritage List for England. However, the Steering Group has identified several additional potential assets for inclusion on the Local Uttlesford Heritage Asset List.

- Mrs Barclay's Fountain Gaston Hill
- The War memorial School Green.
- Charterhouse Burial ground gate, LH Churchyard.
- Gaston Green Chapple.
- Bus shelter opposite school Lower Road.
- Canadian War Memorial, Beadles Common.
- Arched entrance gate from Lower Rd into Little Hallingbury School.
