



## **Little Hallingbury Neighbourhood Plan . Have your say at Regulation 16 - deadline 2<sup>nd</sup> April.**

We're pleased to announce that the Little Hallingbury Neighbourhood Plan (LHNP) was formally submitted to Uttlesford District Council (UDC) in early February. This marks a major step towards shaping how our village grows and develops in the years ahead.

The LHNP has been carefully updated to reflect feedback from residents and consultees, and it has now progressed to the next stage: the Regulation 16 consultation. This is a key opportunity for local people to review the Plan and submit their views to the independent examiner.

### **Have Your Views Heard by the Independent Examiner –Complete the Regulation 16 consultation**

The Regulation 16 consultation is now live on UDC's website. This consultation is the main opportunity to formally support, object to, or suggest changes. Here you can view the revised Plan and submit your comments online or download a paper form to send in. We encourage all residents to take a few minutes to read the Plan and provide their feedback — whether supportive or otherwise — as all representations will be considered by the independent examiner.

The consultation opened on 19<sup>th</sup> February 2026 and will run for six weeks until 2<sup>nd</sup> April, after which the Plan will move on to independent examination. All comments received will be passed to the examiner.

We encourage everyone to take a look and see how community input has shaped the Plan so far.

### **What happens next?**

- The Regulation 16 consultation runs for 6 weeks – anyone can comment
- An Independent Examiner will review the Plan and all comments received and may recommend modifications if deemed necessary.
- A Referendum will be held, and residents can vote on whether the Plan should be adopted

If approved at Referendum, the Neighbourhood Plan will become part of the statutory planning framework for Little Hallingbury, giving the community a stronger voice in future planning decisions.
